Nate K (they/them) Position Sought: **Recording Secretary** Candidate statement:

Hey Comrades! This is Nate humbly asking for your support to be our next recording secretary. I've been an active member and organizer in Atlanta DSA since 2017, when I first got involved after a friend was shot and killed by police. I started the Young DSA chapter at Georgia Tech, then stepped up to lead our chapter's DSA for Bernie 2020 campaign. Since then, I've served the chapter as Recording Secretary and Treasurer, helping steer Atlanta DSA through the pandemic, the George Floyd uprisings, and the Biden administration. Last year, I stepped off the Steering Committee to focus on our campaign to elect Gabriel Sanchez, where I served as Field Director. I organized volunteers and launched canvasses, and together we knocked over 20,000 doors to elect the first-ever Socialist to Georgia's state house.

Today we're facing a world in crisis. Between escalating international wars, climate catastrophe, and rapid increases in the cost of living, liberal capitalism is falling apart at the seams. Now we're up against our biggest challenge yet: a second Trump administration ready to be far more ferocious than the first. I'm a Democratic Socialist and a Marxist because I believe that a better world is possible and that we have the power to win it.

I'm running for chapter leadership because I want to build up Atlanta DSA as a fighting political organization of, by, and for working-class people. As Recording Secretary, I'll keep our chapter minutes and documents well-organized, accessible, and concise, and work to promote a democratic chapter culture of robust political debate and discussion. As a leader, I'll prioritize launching a membership drive to recruit more members and grow our ranks, running our comrade Kelsea for Atlanta City Council, supporting our comrade-elect Gabriel in the state legislature, and organizing member-led unions to build rank-and-file worker power. Brian R (he/him) Position Sought: **At-Large Officer** Candidate statement:

As a chapter member, I've led Atlanta DSA's Political Education Committee, organizing panels, film screenings, reading groups, and discussions to foster collective learning and growth. In 2021, I was elected to the Steering Committee, where I helped grow membership and sustain organizing efforts through the pandemic. Since then, I've served as HGO, establishing and refining our grievance process to ensure a safe and supportive environment for all members. Outside of DSA, I work full-time as a Community Organizer with the Georgia Latino Alliance for Human Rights, focusing on empowering immigrant communities & combating xenophobia through campaigns like ICE-Free Zone and ICE Chasers. I'm also involved with the People's Campaign, a branch of the Stop Cop City movement born from the Referendum Campaign, using bold actions—like our recent demonstration at City Hall—to hold power accountable. As an organizer who joined when DSA had only 8,000 members nationwide, I've seen our growth and the incredible potential to build the strongest socialist movement in U.S. history. I'm running to ensure Atlanta DSA continues building labor power for workers and strengthening electoral strategies to elect and co-govern with leaders like Kelsea B and Gabriel Sanchez. This next year is going to be crucial for us. I will ensure DSA takes a strong, fearless approach to defending the rights & lives of all marginalized communities—immigrants, women, lgbtg+,

Palestinians, Muslims, people of color—by empowering them & standing in solidarity. Together, we can defeat the fascist creep and create a future defined by equity, solidarity, & justice. We have nothing to lose but our chains—and everything to win by organizing together.

Trevor T (he/him) Position Sought: **At-Large Officer** Candidate statement:

We need a Steering Committee that can meet new members where they are and turn them from new members to volunteers to comrades.

The failure of the flailing old guard of the Democratic Party is a tragedy that's given rise to a pernicious new American Fascism, but it in turn presents us an opportunity to build a new opposition that offers real change and speaks to the actual needs of the American working class. We need a Steering Committee ready to rise to that occasion and I think I'd be a great member to help meet that challenge.
